To support our children in their learning at home we have developed an Activity Pack Library. This helps to teach parents how to create fun learning opportunities to support their child in reaching their potential as a learner. Research shows this type of support can have a greater impact than teaching children in nursery. We employ a member of staff to create fun activity packs full of exciting resources. The children choose from a selection each week to bring home and play with an adult.
