# **Animal Spa**

Helping to look after animals is very important. Why not try making your own animal spa where you could really treat them? You can put your teddies and other animals into your spa, and add soft cushions, blankets, bowls or plates, and maybe a brush to help make their fur look beautiful. I'm sure the animals will love all the love and care you'll give them. Can you find out what real animals need to stay healthy?




### **Sticky Spiders Web**

Using tape make a spiders web. You could use a dice or a spinner to find a number. Can you stick the right number of pom-poms onto the web to be flies?

# **Sorting Shapes**

Look around at home to see how many 2D (flat) shapes you can find and see if you can remember the name and the song for each shape. Now add a collection of 3D (solid) shapes. Can you find a cube, cuboid, cylinder, cone and sphere? Sort your collection into 2D shapes and 3D shapes. You might need to ask a grown up for help with the labels. Happy shape hunt!



## **Count and Cover**

Ask your grown up to make you a game board with each square showing spots 1-12. Next roll two dice and count the total number of spots. Find the matching number of spots on your game board, then cover it up with the matching numeral.

### **Dot Pictures**

Make your own spots using a hole punch then design your own picture! This is great for developing your fine motor skills ready for writing!





# Yellow, Orange and White Teddies

### **Roll, Count and Match**

Roll a dice, count the spots and find the numeral to match. Can you count out objects to match?





# **Shape Monsters**

Use leftover cardboard to make some shape monsters. Can you name the shapes that you have made? How many sides do they have? How many corners? Can you sort some smaller objects to feed to your shape monsters?







#### **Pattern Finder**

Ask your grown up to make you a pattern matching game. Use coloured building blocks to build a tower to match the pattern. Can you create your own repeating patterns?





### **Colour Hunt**


Go on a nature colour hunt. Can you sort your finds into colour groups? Use your treasures to make matching colour faces!

#### **Colour Hunt**

Pick some fresh flowers and place them inside empty egg shells. Fill them up with water and place them in the freezer for a few hours (use the egg box to keep them upright). You could use colour the water with a drop of paint or food colouring. The result is some beautiful natural eggs. Watch what happens as they melt. Can you find up a way to speed up the melting process? Try warm water or even salt.

## **Alien Eyes**

Can you help the aliens find their eyes? You could use buttons, or draw some eyes to match their number.



# **Paper Cup Counting**

Paper cups are a great way of practising counting accurately. Ask a grown up to write numbers 1-10 into the bottom of the cups. Can you count the matching number of objects into each cup?



#### Flower Vases

Draw a vase onto some corrugated cardboard and ask a grown up to pierce some holes into it. You can thread flowers that you find outside through the holes to fill your vase.



### **Car Passengers**

Ask a grown up to draw you some cars and number them. Can you place the matching number of passengers into each car? You could make your own number cars using cardboard boxes!

# Name Recognition Snack

Use food colouring and letter stamps to press your name into some bread. You can now use it to make a tasty sandwich!

#### **Coloured Bubble Art**

Add a few drops of paint to your bubble mixture and catch the bubbles on paper to make some fantastic artwork!



## **Shape Sponges**

Sponges are great for printing with to practise shape names and makes a lovely art. activity for little hands!



## **Colour Sorting**

Use painted cardboard tubes and coloured pegs to make a simple colour sorting activity. Can you name the colours?



# Rainbow Ice Gloop

Mix cornflour and water at a 2:1 ratio to make 'gloop'. Drop in some coloured ice cubes to make rainbow gloop! Add a few tools like spoons, bowls and cups and let your child explore as the colours bleed out and spread.
