We hope everyone has been able to join us on Seesaw, to access your child's online learning journal. This is our main method of communication. Please ensure you have notifications turned on to receive alerts for new messages, including letters, reminders and photographs of your child accessing the nursery provision. If you need support with this, speak to a member of staff in nursery.

Our Nursery Curriculum.

The curriculum we offer in our school is built around the children's interests, identified through observations by the skilled team of nursery practitioners. We develop the whole child—learning to be confident, sociable, independent and inquisitive. Having a positive attitude and making positive relationships.

Alongside children's individual interests we have planned times when the children are taught new concepts they may otherwise not know about. We have developed a progressive curriculum which supports children in revisiting learning and building upon this over time.

Each term we will be looking at different cultures through festivals and celebrations. We will introduce our core books from our reading policy and develop mathematical learning through regular short fun activities and challenges.

We value partnerships with families and will have opportunities for you to come and join in with nursery events. If you have free time and would like to volunteer, we would really appreciate any help (this may be reading with the children or helping to cut and laminate in the office). Please speak to a member of the nursery team if you are interested.

To raise funds for Christmas events we will be running a sponsored football skills event in November. The generosity of the nursery community is always valued and the funds raised are put to good use to benefit your children.

We continue to place an emphasis upon teaching our children about helping others through harvest collections for the East Durham Trust FEED project and Mission Christmas (donating Christmas gifts for children in our local community who would otherwise not receive a gift).

A few polite reminders

When leaving the school grounds **please hold your child's hand**, we do not want anyone to come to harm on the road.

Please write your child's name in all the clothing they wear to nursery.

Please try your best to **arrive at or before 9am**. The 3-4year nursery children have their taught group activity at this time. Those children arriving late are missing out on this valuable time.

Snack money is £2 for 15hour children and £2.50 for 30hour children, this is paid to your child's key person. Snack money for paid 2s is included in fees.

Changing bags need to be clearly named on the outside please. Only children who are in nappies or toilet training need to bring bags to nursery as coat peg space is limited.

All the dates for the term are included in the calendar attached and on the nursery website. Reminders will be shared on Seesaw.
